

This Mahotsav remains dedicated to the Indian people who have not only been instrumental in driving India thus far in its developmental journey and who hold the potential to facilitate Prime Minister Modi's dream of triggering India 2.0, fuelled by the vibrancy of Atmanirbhar Bharat.

In addition, Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav refers to an epitome of all that is progressive about India's political, socio-cultural, and economic identity. This Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav officially began on 12th March 2021, which initiated a 75-week countdown to India's 75th Independence anniversary and will complete after a year on 15th August 2023.

# **Understanding Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav meaning and significance**

Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav is celebrated to pay homage to India's freedom movement and freedom fighters. In addition, during this celebration, the country will remember all the significant landmarks during India's independence movement. India will gain new power for future growth, and Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav reminisces the elixir of the value of freedom.

It echoes motivation from freedom warriors, new visions, new resolutions, and self-dependence. It strives to facilitate the youth and scholars to shoulder the accountability for fulfilling the country's efforts in recording the history of our Independence fighters. Furthermore, it aims to showcase the accomplishments of the independence movement to the world.

The Indian Independence Day is celebrated every year on August 15 to commemorate the nation's freedom and independence.

#### Activities planned under 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav'

- Curtain Raiser, launching initiatives under India@75: At the curtain-raiser, activities got inaugurated under the theme name India@75. Namely, a website, film, song, Aatmanirbhar Incubator and Aatmanirbhar Charkha.
- PM Narendra Modi inaugurated a website for Amrit Mahotsav. In addition, an 'Atmanirbhar Incubator' was embarked that seeks to help almost 40,000 households involved in the conventional art.

- The Central Government has formed a board under Central Home Minister Amit Shah. The panel will draft policies and planning of different events as part of the festivities.
- The Regional Outreach Bureau has arranged a five-day-long handicraft exhibition in Rajasthan.
- In Madhya Pradesh, Amrit Mahotsav of freedom is getting organized at all 52 district offices of the state, including the areas associated with the freedom movement and Jana Nayaks including Orchha, Niwari district related to Tatya Tope, Alirajpur district, the motherland of Chandrashekhar Azad, Jabalpur with Rani Durgavati and numerous more.
- In Tamil Nadu and Karnataka, exhibitions, cycle jatha, tree plantation, and processions were scheduled to remember the freedom fighters.
- As a part of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav,' a tremendous outreach initiative titled 'Conservation
  to co-existence: The people connect' has been undertaken by the Mumbai Central Zoo
  Authority. The movement aims to create awareness about protecting specified 75 wild
  animal species. Persistent public attention for 75 weeks, topping on 15th August, would
  help accomplish this.

#### Inauguration of 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' with padayatra

On 12th March 2021, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav.' The event happened in Ahmedabad, Gujarat, and the Mahotsav is getting launched from cities that were prominent hubs of India's freedom battle. It included Sabarmati Ashram, Jallianwala Bagh in Punjab, Cellular Jail in Andaman and Nicobar Islands, etc. 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' started with the Prime Minister flagging off Dandi March from Sabarmati Ashram.

#### Key highlights of this padayatra

- It is a metaphorical 386-km "Dandi March" to Dandi in the Navsari district of South Gujarat from Sabarmati Ashram in Ahmedabad.
- The Padayatra started with 81 marchers and will be completed on 5th April 2021 after 25 days.
- It has celebrated the 91st anniversary of the historic salt march ushered in by the Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi.

Mr Ravindra B N and Mr B K Madhu Asst Professors coordinated the drive.












#### **Psoriasis Awareness Action Month**

The informational booklet was circulated through virtual mode to make aware of the diseases.



#### What is psoriasis?

Psoriasis is a chronic autoimmune condition that causes the rapid buildup of skin cells. This buildup of cells causes scaling on the skin's surface.

Inflammation and redness around the scales is fairly common. Typical psoriatic scales are whitish-silver and develop in thick, red patches, Sometimes, these patches will crack and bleed.

Psoriasis is the result of a sped-up skin production process. Typically, skin cells grow deep in the skin and slowly rise to the surface. Eventually, they fall off. The typical life cycle of a skin cell is one month.

#### Psoriasis trigger: stress, alcohol and more

External "triggers" may start a new bout of psoriasis. These triggers aren't the same for everyone. They may also change over time for you.

you. The most common triggers for psoriasis include:

Creece

Unusually high stress may trigger a flare-up, if you learn to reduce and manage your stress, you can reduce and possibly prevent flare-ups.

Alcoho

Heavy alcohol use can trigger psoriasis flareups. If you excessively use alcohol, psoriasis outbreaks may be more frequent. Reducing alcohol consumption is smart for more than just your skin too. Your doctor can help you form a plan to quit drinking if you need help.

- Type 2 Diabetes
- Inflammatory Bowel Disease
- · Heart disease
- Psoriatic Arthritis
- Anxiety





## Is psoriasis contagious?

Psoriasis isn't contagious. You can't pass the skin condition from one person to another. Touching a psoriatic lesion on another person won't cause you to develop the condition.

It's important to be educated on the condition, as many people think psoriasis is contagious.



#### Avoid trigger foods

Psoriasis causes inflammation. Certain foods cause inflammation too. Avoiding those foods might improve symptoms. These foods include:

- red meat
- · refined sugar
- · processed foods
- · dairy products
- . Drink less alcohol








#### World Mental Health Day






#### International Student's Day


candidates including students, teaching and non-teaching staffs got benefited. The staffs of PHC, Bellur are thanked for their support towards the conduct of this drive.

# World Food Safety Day

# The importance of food safety

Each year, one in ten people fall ill from eating unsafe food. Unsafe food particularly affects the most vulnerable groups: pregnant women, children under five, elderly and people with compromised immune systems. Consumers can make a difference by preventing foodborne diseases, keeping informed and promoting food safety. By making safe and healthy dietary choices and practising safe food handling at home, you help reduce the global burden of disease and support sustainable food systems.

Most foodborne diseases are preventable with proper food handling. You and your family can make a diffrence!

# How to achieve food safety at home

- Keep clean. Wash your hands with soap and clean water before handling food and often while preparing food. Germs are easily transferred from hands to food during meal preparation and consumption. Food contact surfaces must be cleaned and sanitized after each use.
- Keep food at safe temperatures. Bacteria that cause food poisoning multiply quickest in the temperature "danger zone"- between 5°C and 60°C. Therefore, keep food below 5°C and above 60°C. Chill food promptly and properly.
- Avoid confusion and ensure freshness of food by labelling and dating stored ingredients and prepared foods. Any food item not stored in its original packaging must be labelled.
- Use safe water and raw materials. Wash your fruits and vegetable with clean water before eating them.
- Use clean utensils and disinfect surfaces and cleaning material. To make a sanitizing solution, mix 5 ml of household bleach in 750 ml of water. Alternatively, you can use boiling water to sanitize utensils.

28th Jul 2022


ACU- NSS Unit Sri Adichunchanagiri College of Pharmacy, B G Nagara, an Information booklet about Hepatitis was prepared and circulated largely on social media to create awareness about the disease.

NSS Unit also organised Community Awareness Programme on account of \*World Hepatitis Day\* on 28th july 2022 at Kuchahalli.

The progarmme started with the conduct of Rally to sensitize the common people towards Hepatitis and its preventive measures with the display of Placards.

The volunteers also visited the houses in Kuchahalli and educated the people through distribution of leaflets.

Around 150 people attended the programme.





With a person dying every 30 seconds from a hepatitis related illness - even in the current COVID-19 crisis - we can't wait to act on viral hepatitis.

- People living with viral hepatitis unaware can't wait for testing
- People living with hepatitis can't wait for life saving treatments
- Expectant mothers can't wait for hepatitis screening and treatment
- Newborn babies can't wait for birth dose vaccination
- People affected by hepatitis can't wait to end stigma and discrimination
- Community organisations can't wait for greater investment
- Decision makers can't wait and must act now to make hepatitis elimination a reality through political will and funding.

#### What is Hepatitis?

Hepatitis is an inflammation of the liver. The condition can be self-limiting or can progress to fibrosis (scarring), cirrhosis or liver cancer. Hepatitis viruses are the most common cause of hepatitis in the world but other infections, toxic substances (e.g. alcohol, certain drugs), and autoimmune diseases can also cause hepatitis.

There are 5 main hepatics viruses, referred to as types A, B, C, D and E. These 5 types are of greatest concern because of the burden of illness and death they cause and the potential for outbreaks and epidemic spread. In particular, types B and C lead to chronic disease in hundreds of millions of people and, together, are the most common cause of liver cirrhosis and

Hepatitis A and E are typically caused by ingestion of contaminated food or water. Hepatitis B, C and D usually occur as a result of parenteral contact with infected body fluids. Common modes of transmission for these viruses include receipt of contaminated blood or blood products, invasive medical procedures using contaminated equipment and for hepatitis B transmission from mother to baby at birth, from family member to child, and also by sexual contact.

Acute infection may occur with limited or no symptoms, or may include symptoms such as jaundice (yellowing of the skin and eyes), dark urine, extreme fatigue, nausea, vomiting and abdominal pain.

#### Hepatitis E

- Hepatitis E is an inflammation of the liver caused by infection with the hepatitis E virus (HEV).
- Every year there are an estimated 20 million HEV infections worldwide, leading to an estimated 3.3 million symptomatic cases of hepatitis E.
- WHO estimates that hepatitis E caused approximately 44 000 deaths in 2015 (accounting for 3.3% of the mortality due to viral hepatitis).
- The virus is transmitted via the fecal-oral route, principally via contaminated water.
- Hepatitis E is found worldwide, but the disease is most common in East and South Asia.
- A vaccine to prevent hepatitis E virus infection has been developed and is licensed in China, but is not yet available elsewhere.
