A REPORT ON WORLDBREASTFEEDING DAY CELEBRATION -2017

World Breastfeeding Day was celebrated, in association with Department of Pediatrics, on 17th August 2017. The programme was based on the theme “Sustaining Breastfeeding Together” with the aim to support and promote breastfeeding in lactating women.

Dr T M Manohar in his inaugural speech gave an overview on the necessity of breastfeeding & its importance in building up a proper index in children. He shared his valuable thoughts and discussed about the present scenario & perspectives of breastfeeding.

The PIL Prepared by department on “Effective Approach On Importance of Menstrual Hygiene Management” was released by Dr.TM Manohar, distributed among the guests & gathered lactating mothers.



The inauguration speech by Dr.T M Manohar

Dr. Shruti Purushotam from Department of Pediatrics addressed the gathering and stressed on the importance and necessity of breastfeeding, the right postures and advised about the food and nutrients for lactating mothers. The session encouraged the mothers to clarify their doubts and dilemmas.

The next event was a Skit performed by Pharm D students. The skit visualized the comparison between 2 lactating mothers, one from a well settled family and other from a mediocre family. The modern mother preferred formula milk for her child whereas the other mother did the breastfeeding. Apparently both the mothers meet each other during a regular check up at the hospital. The doctor then highlights the negative effects of formula milk which led to the child being unhealthy and falling sick frequently. The other child who is healthy is because of breastfeeding which increases the immunity and avoids illnesses. The doctor even explains the future consequences of formula milk through an open conversation with the patient. The skit also highlighted the role of clinical pharmacist in providing patient counseling.

The programme included theme tutorial with pictograms that was explained by Pharm D students. The scrap comprised of pictures on beneficial effects of breastfeeding, preferred food supplements, hygiene measures, important medication and its administration technique and drugs to be avoided during lactation.

A Report On Sensitization Programme On Adverse Drug Reaction Monitoring, Reporting, Role & Responsibilities Of Pharmacovigilance Programme Of India

Department of Pharmacy Practice, SAC College of Pharmacy, BG Nagara, conducted a sensitization program on Pharmacovigilance on 09 Feb 2016.

The programme resource person wascNagarjuna reddy Pharmacovigilance associate PVPI.

With case example he explained WHO Causality assessment of ADR with the help of ADR Reporting form of PvPi. He also given examples of ADRs of commonly used herbs and herbal drug interactions and finally he spoke on benefits of reporting ADRS to PvPi. Also he detailed the network of PvPi, ADRs reporting status of PvPi since 2011 from all around India.

Around 90 students from our college and 25 students along with professor Mr. K. Ramkumar Professor dept of pharmacy practice and other staff members of benefited from this sensitization programme.



BRIEF REPORT ABOUT ACPE CONFERENCE (AUSTRALIA)

ISPE 10TH Asian conference on pharmacoepidemiology conference (ACPE) was arranged in PACE center, University of Queensland, Australia from 29-31 October. Over 300 delegates attended this conference from different countries. From India over 10 delegates attended and presented their research. Among them, Dr. Ramanath who had received partial scholarship from SAC College of pharmacy and shared his research finding in the form of poster (Title: MAB & QOL study in Elderly patients. P.code:259)

On the first day preconference on the advance programme in pharmaco-epidemiology and the areas necessary to be researched and different scenarios in epidemiology of different countries (Topics covered: use of PE, Instruments, Patient generated PE, advance methods of PE) were delivered by the eminent scientist.

On the second day they discussed about various topics like PE database, method, policies, evaluation and challenges of PE and on the third day (Topics: PE in pediatrics, Canada & Nordic countries etc) the poster evaluation and assessment was carried out by the experts. The selected one was even presented as a spot light discussion.

As part of the conference attendance a visit was made to Griffith University Pharmacy School on 27 Oct 2017 and the programmes we offered in the college were discussed with the Griffith university professor faculty in Gold coast Australia.

INTER-DEPARTMENT GUEST LECTURES BY DEPARTMENT OF PHARMACOLOGY

The department of pharmacology had organized inter-department guest lectures on 30.11.2017 in college premises. A total of four guest lectures including hands on skill session was arranged.

Dr. Prakash Goudanavar, Professor & Head, Department of Pharmaceutics delivered lecture on Generic Drug Development. He discussed in detail about the generic drugs development process including its bio-availability and bio-equivalence aspects. There was discussion about patient perceptions, professional's perceptions and other stakeholders' perceptions in detail. The lecture was much appealing and convincing to the audience.

Dr. Anne Gowda HV, Head, Department of Pharmacognosy, spoke on the topic, Insight into the dissertation designing. He spoke in detail right from proposing of hypothesis, writing introduction, methodology to carry out literature survey, mentioning of material and methods, various means of presenting study results, logical discussion on results deduced and drawing study conclusions. He stressed much on plagiarism and also narrated on various softwares available to check it. He gave detailed data about acceptable range of plagiarism by certain selected universities across the country. The seminar indeed produced much awareness about the art of scientific writing.



The third session was on Research methodology and was delivered by Dr. Meena Purohit, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Pharmaceutical Chemistry. The discussion was in detail comprising right from how to select a research topic, fix the research title, justifying research needs, applying statistics and its importance.



Dr. Nitin B Charbe, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Chemistry demonstrated and explained the exhaustive and effective use of Microsoft word in thesis writing. He explained with demonstration about creation of headings at different levels, alignment and alteration of tables and figures without affecting serial numbers all along the finalized manuscript. He also explained and demonstrated many in built features of Microsoft word as an effective tool in designing of thesis. The hands on skill type session imparted good training for the participants.



VISIT TO Dr. D. Y. Patil Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences & Research

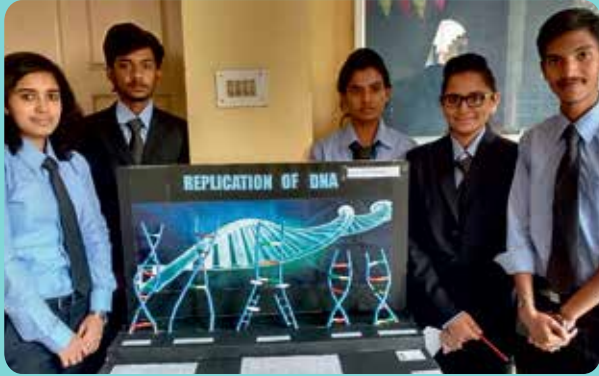
