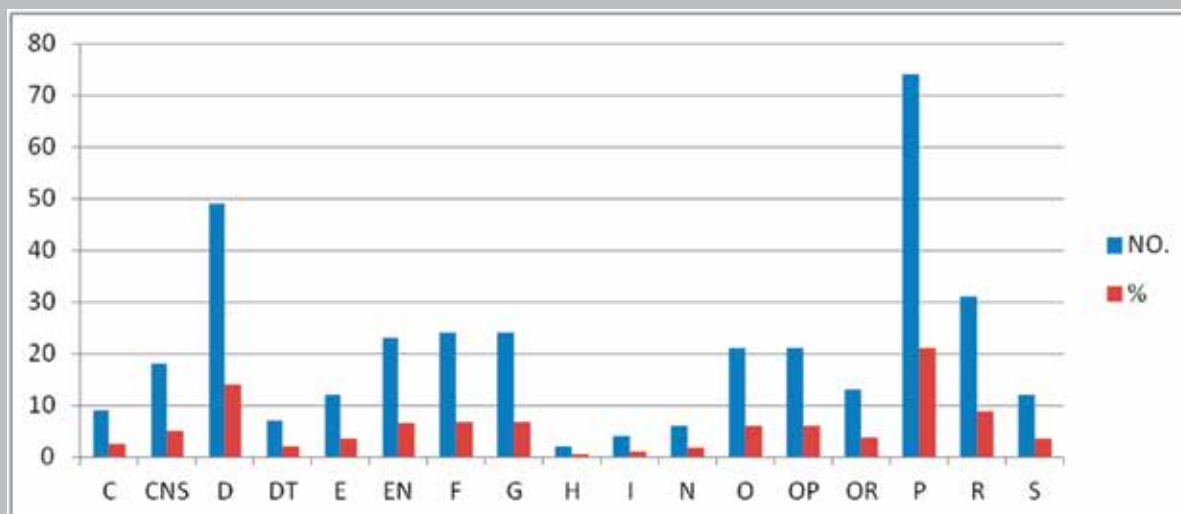


Figure 1: Disease wise distribution of the patients.

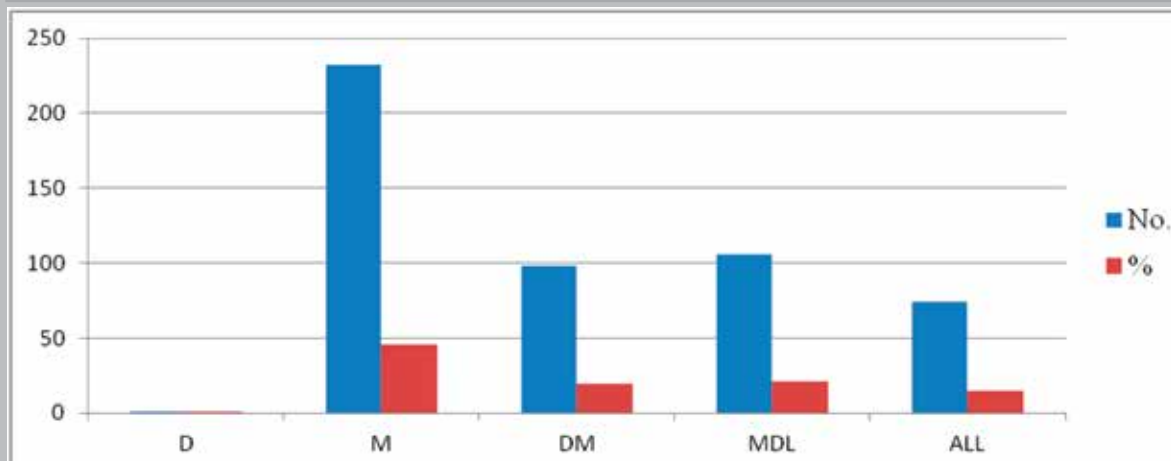


Figure 2: Counseling Parameters

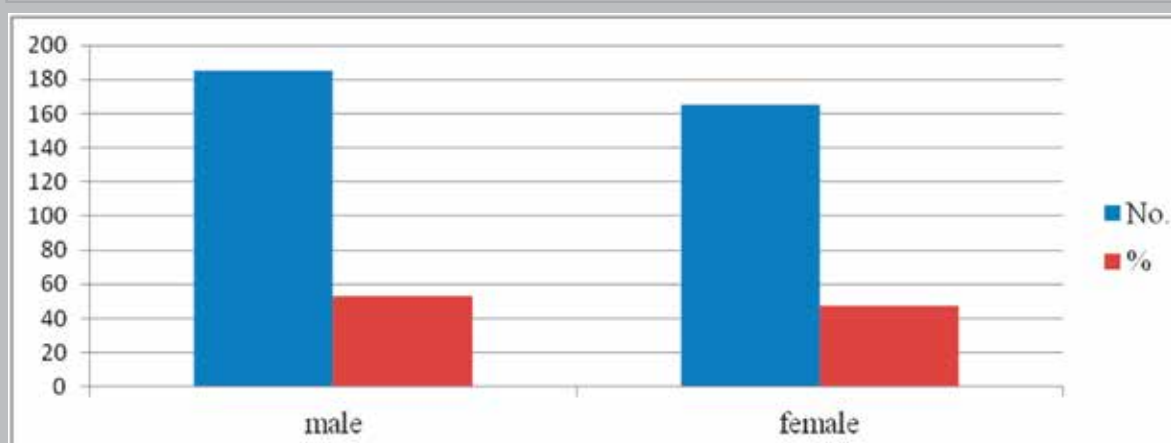


Figure 3: Gender Wise Distribution of the Patients
